	<p><i>Local authority funded: BeU Swindon: mental health support</i></p>		<p><i>Referrals can be made by school with consent from parents. Parents can also refer. Cases are then triaged by the team and the best support provided if it is felt it is needed.</i></p>
	<p><i>School nurse</i></p>	<p><i>North Locality team. Current designated nurse is Bree Lucas</i></p>	<p><i>Referrals made by school and contact is made with parents by the SNN team. Support and advice given on eating, toileting, medical concerns and mental health needs. Care plans will be written by the SNN team for certain</i></p>

			<p>medical needs or if other health practitioners are involved such as designated Children's Community Nurses. Schools are responsible for writing care plans for children relating to certain needs and the administering of regular medication. Parents are asked to update or amend care plans each year and school nurse training provided to staff every September.</p>
	Hearing Support service	Jess Prophet	<p>Support and in school monitoring for children with hearing aids fitted. Referrals are external through the hospital.</p>
	Physical disabilities advisory team	Anna Kingsbury	<p>Referrals are made by school for children with long term physical difficulties that school may need adaptations or specific resources being put in place as well as monitoring visits and regular advice.</p>
	Autism outreach support	Connex Sarah Montague Smith	<p>Referrals made by school to SASS. In school observation and advice given through regular outreach visits. This is for children with social and communication difficulties or ASD.</p>

	<i>HCRG Care group SALT (Speech and Language Therapy)</i>	<i>No designated therapist</i>	<i>Children with EHCPs and communication as their primary or secondary need will be seen in school when there are concerns or help is needed for next steps or contributions to review meetings. Referrals can be made by the school when continued concerns are present with SAL. If accepted, then an initial assessment will be carried out by the SAL team and support is recommended. There is no ongoing involvement when a child is over 5 years old. Children with pronunciation difficulties are often seen in clinics outside of school.</i>
	<i>Occupational Therapy</i>	<i>No designated therapist</i>	<i>Referrals can be made by school when a child has a diagnosis of ASD. Children without a diagnosis can refer through their GP.</i>
	<i>Physiotherapy</i>	<i>No designated therapist</i>	<i>Referrals made by school. Support and monitoring where needed</i>
